


Budget Consultation 2017-18


Your opinions, views and ideas matter.



The budget for current services provided in 2016-17 shows £19.1m gross spend detailed in the diagram opposite. The net budget after income is £6.3m.

The Council Tax paid is broken down in the diagram opposite. The Richmondshire District Council element provides a range of services including refuse collection, recycling, housing, environmental health, benefits to name but a few.

The average monthly payment for Richmondshire District Council services is £20.00


